

#### The Book of Job

At our April meeting, Council Lecturer Don Roberts presented a summary of the Book of Job. The poetic dialogues between Job and his friends explore the difficult issue of the meaning of suffering in the life of a just person. Job's friends repeatedly insist that the evil things that have befallen him must be God's punishments for Job's sins. Job responds just as repeatedly that he is innocent. Eventually, Job challenges God to explain Himself. God answers by reminding Job of how incapable he would have been to create the world and make it function as God has done. He likewise challenges Job's ability to administer divine justice. Job, confronted with his human limitations, admits that he has challenged God about things he cannot comprehend.


#### **30 MINUTES TO LIVE**

A baby in Australia beat the odds and survived after doctors initially predicted she would only live for 30 minutes after birth. During an ultrasound, a large grapefruit-size tumor was seen in the baby's chest. However, Lily Rudd and her identical twin sister Frances just

celebrated their first birthday. It is a remarkable milestone for Lily.

When she was born, the tumor was crushing her heart and lungs. Her condition is said to be so rare, that cases like it have only been seen 30 times worldwide. But after birth, doctors did everything they could to save her. Lily was taken to The Royal Children's Hospital for emergency surgery. She remained on life support for two months following the surgery, and her prognosis was very bad. But after 97 days in the hospital, she was able to go home with her parents and twin sister. Her pediatric surgeon called it "miraculous." Parents are often encouraged to abort a child who has a life-threatening health condition. Thankfully, this was never a consideration by these parents for their baby girl who overcame a challenging situation. Her father said, "She's perfect." (Source: Live Action)

**2024 LIFE LIST** - Americans United for Life recently released their "2024 Life List" which meticulously ranks each state from the most to the least pro-life. The Life List offers a comprehensive evaluation based on state laws pertaining to abortion, legal recognition of pre-born children, bioethics (including destructive human embryo research), assisted suicide, end-of-life patient care, and healthcare rights of conscience. Arkansas is ranked first as the most pro-life state; Vermont is at the bottom as the least pro-life. Where does New Hampshire fall? NH ranks in the bottom half and is 33rd on the list. ### **APRIL 14, 2024**

### **Third Sunday of Easter**



When I was a kid, a friend at my home parish told me, "If you get to Mass by the Gospel reading, it counts!" As a lifelong late-arriver, it's something I have told myself many times, especially in my earlier years as a Catholic. If the "it counts" is justifiable on a pathetically minimal scale of liturgical legalism, then the Gospel reading today shows how

insanely wrong-headed it is, and how helpful it is to re-think the Mass in its light.

The famous "Road to Emmaus" story recounts, on that first Sunday of the Resurrection, the basic two-fold structure of the Mass: *Word*, followed by *Eucharist*. Jesus spends a significant period of time with two dismayed disciples, as he connects a wide swath of the Hebrew scriptures with his own suffering, death, and resurrection. They would later report that this Liturgy of the Word touched their hearts with an inexplicable fire. This Word-induced flame alone is what leads the two disciples to discover Jesus' presence in the "breaking of the bread."

With this in mind, how can we possibly think that the Liturgy of the Word is unnecessary or incidental? The two disciples needed the Scriptures explained to them in order to experience Jesus alive in the eucharistic breaking of bread. Sure, we say, but they had the Risen Jesus. But that's precisely the point: Jesus is risen and accompanies us in both parts of the Mass. Imagine how much our experience of Jesus in the Eucharist would deepen if we (preachers and listeners) took even more seriously that Jesus himself sets our hearts ablaze with his Word so that we know him in the Eucharist. That Word-induced fire counts, too!



### DIOCESE OF MANCHESTER ADDS TO LIST OF CLERGY ACCUSED OF SEXUAL ABUSE OF A MINOR

On April 10, 2024, the Diocese of Manchester added three priests to its list of clergy accused of sexual abuse of a minor as part of its continuing effort and commitment to protecting children and young people. The information, assignment histories, and additional resources are available at **catholicnh.org/restoringtrust**.

Reverend George Desjardins has been listed on the Restoring Trust website under the category "Cases Concluded" for a report of abuse that took place more than forty years ago that was received recently. Fr. Desjardins is alive and has been retired since 2002. He is prohibited from ministry.

Reverend Matthew Schultz has been listed on the Restoring Trust website under the category "Cases in Process," which are cases involving living Diocesan priests, but where the canonical proceedings are not yet complete. Fr. Schultz is prohibited from ministry. Out of respect for those involved and because the case is still in process, no further information will be disclosed at this time.

Reverend André Thibodeau has been listed on the Restoring Trust website of the Diocese of Manchester as a Deceased Priest accused of sexual abuse of a minor for a report received after his death. Fr. Thibodeau died in 2015.

Law enforcement has been notified of the reports concerning all three priests. Whenever it becomes aware of a report of sexual abuse of a minor by a priest, deacon, diocesan employee, or volunteer, the Diocese ensures that the New Hampshire Attorney General's office is notified, even if the misconduct took place many years ago.

Anyone with information pertaining to sexual abuse in the Church is encouraged to make a report to law enforcement. For information on how to report abuse, to request counseling or other services, or to learn more about how the Diocese of Manchester works to create a safe environment in all our ministries, visit **catholicnh.org/safety**.

On Saturday, March 26: 9am in church—Catechism for all public grade school children including those in 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade. Classes for High School will resume after Lent. Please observe "no parking" on the side of the street opposite the church.

March 28: Monday, 7pm – Memorial Hall (Library) – Meeting for all men over 16 years of age interested in the Holy Name Society.

April 3: Passion Sunday – Holy Name Society reorganized – Meetings every first Monday of each month.

April 10: Palm Sunday – Choir rehearsal after 10am Mass and again on Monday/Tuesday/Wednesday at 7pm. Work on the Parish Hall every Tuesday and Wednesday evenings. Holy Thursday, Mass at 7am (Communion only at 6am) Procession and unveiling of the Altar –Adoration during the day was assigned by locale: 8am to 12 noon: Depot, Mill, Johnson, Sargent and Lawrence Street, Gilmanton Road; – 12 to 7pm: Church, Main Spring, Gale, High and Concord Street, Laconia Road, and South Road – Holy Hour at 7pm

April 17: Institute for Teaching Religion under the CCD at Saint John's Hall, Laconia, every Tuesday (7-9) beginning April 26. Instructors: Sisters of Mercy and Fathers Hathaway and McDonough. Purpose: To train teachers for the summer vacation school.

May 8: Tuesday – 7:30pm – Parish Hall meeting for women and young girls over 16 of age to organize a Parish group. Winnisquam Mission: starting May 15 to June 19. -Holy Mass at 9am: starting June 19 to Labor Day, Holy Mass 7am and 10am; Labor Day to Columbus Day:— Holy Mass at 9am.

May 29: On Memorial Day, members of the Holy Name Society will assemble at the Legion Home at 10:45 am to partake in parade: Memorial Services.

Communion breakfast of Holy Name Society on June 12. Men will march to Parish Hall after church.

Starting Wednesday, June 22, and every Wednesday at the Parish Hall: beano parties for benefit of Parish and Parish Hall.

August 21: Wednesday – 8pm – Beano party with \$25. Door prize.

September 11: Monday -7pm – monthly meeting of Holy Name Society— Cribbage Tournament after the meeting. Census will begin in Winnisquam; Fuel collection will be taken up during the census visit.

October 9: Beano parties discontinued until further notice. Census still continues. Instructions for converts taking place.

October 23: Parish census completed. Halloween party on October 29 for Holy Name and Altar Societies and their guests.

October 27: Collection for kneeling cushions.

December 11: 1<sup>st</sup> Communion on January 1, 1950 New Year's Day, at 8am Mass, during 40 hours followed by Communion breakfast served by Altar Society.
