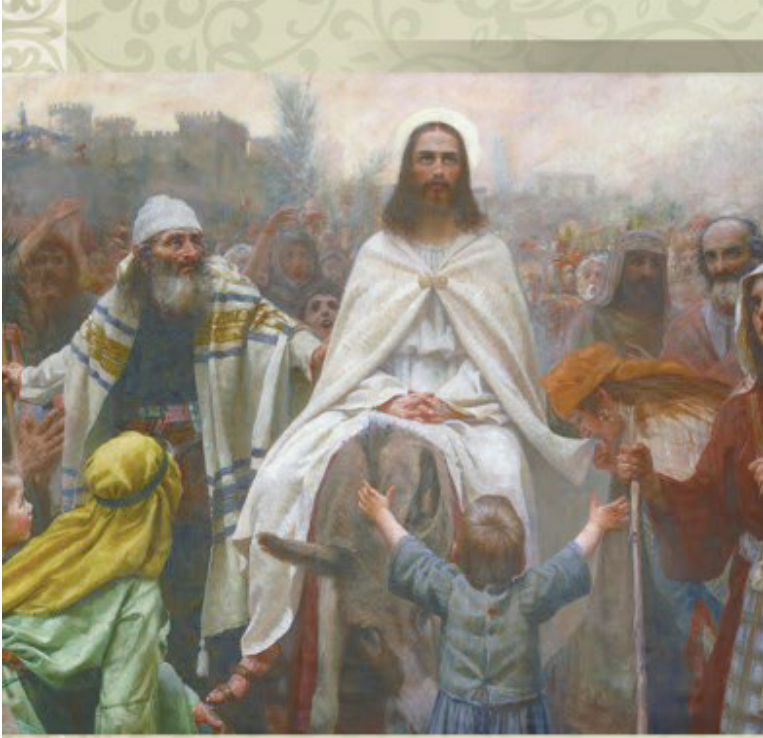

LET'S BUILD A CULTURE OF LIFE



PALM SUNDAY MAKES US THE PEOPLE OF LIFE – God destroys death and renews our conviction that He cares about human life, and that we must as well. With the passion and death

of Christ, no human being should be indifferent to violence. In the light of what Christ did to rescue us from death, we realize our call to rescue others from death. This rescue starts with the most vulnerable human beings in our midst. These are the children still living within their mothers' wombs, and deprived of the right to life by abortion. Some are tempted to take life rather than sacrifice themselves to protect and nurture it. Yet when we see what God has done for us, we find that the very meaning of life is to give ourselves for the good of the other.

In the light of Palm Sunday, it makes no sense to hold back on our love, or our sacrifice on behalf of human life. And it is that simple truth that the palm branches we carry home today are meant as a reminder throughout the year. Let us run to the cross of Christ, thanking Him for the eternal life He brings, and resolving to be the People of Life in the world. As Christ saved us, let us pray that we too may save the helpless among us, including the poor, the unwelcome, and the preborn. (Source: Priests for Life)

Divine Mercy Novena

We would like to encourage all parishioners to pray a Novena to the Divine Mercy beginning Good Friday.

Prayed on ordinary rosary beads, The Chaplet of The Divine Mercy is an intercessory prayer that extends the offering of the Eucharist. It may be said at any time, but our Lord specifically told St. Faustina to recite it during the nine days before the Feast of Mercy (the first Sunday after Easter). He then added: **"By this Novena, [of Chaplets] I will grant every possible grace to souls."** (796)

In His revelations to St. Faustina, Our Lord asked for a special remembrance of His Passion. Pamphlets are available at both churches for those who would like to pray this intercessory prayer.

GOSPEL MEDITATION - UNDERSTANDING SCRIPTURE
PALM SUNDAY - LUKE 19:28-40

“As he rode along, the people were spreading their cloaks on the road.”

Consider how useless it is to spread your clothes on the ground for a donkey to walk on. The clothes get smeared with hooves, and who knows the grimy places where they've been? The animal may leave some unsavory presents on them. They may get stolen by a thief looking to make a buck. The thorns, thistles, rocks and muck of the road will leave stains. The clothes may never be useful again, and you'll probably walk home shivering without your normal covering. Yet this is precisely the gesture the people employ to welcome Jesus and his donkey. Why does this detail matter?



Wastefulness is an essential part of celebration. Consider the unnecessary extravagance of Christmas decorations, confetti and ticker tape parades, baseball players spraying each other with bottles of champagne after a victory, birthday gifts for kids and so on. This wastefulness signals celebration and therefore participation in higher identities (as believers, winners, and parents, to mention the above examples). That's what the wasted cloaks are all about. Those who donate their cloaks participate in Christ's kingship in Jerusalem — and we savor it two thousand years later.

The lesson? Learn how to “waste” money, time, clothes, and food on Christ. We do this at Mass, but in so many other ways, too, like serving the poor, going on retreats, and doing prayerful study. When we practice this holy wastefulness, Jesus will ride into our lives and we'll be more deeply members of his kingdom.

I AM THE PALM

Before He knew me, I was His shade on the first journey. His mother stopped beneath my arms to rest. If it were not for the star, He would not have seen me beside the stable, my branches rustling for joy, my trunk shining in the light and my leaves as green as Christmas.

For more than 30 years, I saw Him walk my world and His. I gave Him my fruit when He was hungry. I gave Him my shelter when He was tired. From the hot sun, He sought the sanctuary of my shadow.

I was His oasis in the desert. I was His guide along the road. In his youth, I was young. In His maturity, I was thick and heavy with strength.

I heard Him speak to His Father on the mountain far above my head. I watched Him bend to the child at my feet. And all that I saw and heard through the passage of time made my fruit sweeter to His lips.

When He came to Jerusalem that day, I gave my branches willingly that they might become a carpet and that He might know that I had joined my arms to those outstretched to Him in faith and love.

When He passed by again, my carpet had withered and died. My leaves were brown and sharp beneath His feet.

I had nourished Him. I had given Him shelter. I had been a part of His coming and going, His victory and release.

Now the cross and the thorns are my companions, and all of us are a part of the plan. I know this as they do, and we rejoice that we were chosen. But I am old now, and I weep.

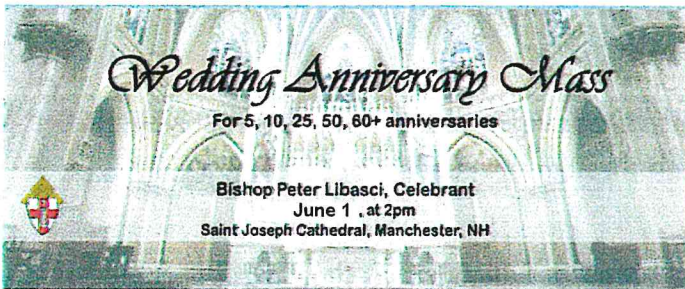

Keep Kids Safe - Code of Conduct

Did you know? The Diocese of Manchester has established a Code of Conduct, known as *Serving Christ, Serving Others*, which requires that all "Church personnel" (priests, deacons, religious men and women, and laypeople who work or volunteer at diocesan parishes, schools, administration, etc.) exhibit the highest ethical standards and personal integrity at all times. The Code includes, among other things, standards for appropriate conduct and boundaries when working with minors. RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR EVERYDAY MOMENTS

A God Who Knows How It Feels

Christ could have spoken anything from the cross, so why did he choose to recite Psalm 22? And why is it so important that we recite that same Psalm at today's Mass?

"My God, my God, why have You abandoned me?"

We've never known the Jesus of the Gospels to doubt the will of God. We've never known him to be a defeatist or to give into feelings of despair. He's the hero who walks on water, the Savior who is welcomed to Jerusalem with a pathway of palms. And he knows how this story ends; he knows full well that his Father has absolutely *not* abandoned him.

So why does he say this? Jesus doesn't make offhanded comments, especially in his last hour. Today, when we repeat the words that he calls out in his darkest moment, we must remember that he wants us, very particularly, to consider them.

With his crucifixion, Jesus reminds us of his humanity. He is a man of flesh that can be torn and blood that can be shed. Somehow, in tandem with his divinity, he still possesses a heart that knows fear and pain and longing. And with this seemingly hopeless cry, he reminds us of that.

Let us never doubt that Jesus can relate to us in our brokenness. This is the week, friends. This is the week that reminds us that our God is a God who knows every pang, every trembling, and every uncertainty of human life. Our God knows what abandonment feels like. He knows what rejection feels like. He knows what it is to keep going when the strength and the will has disappeared. — Tracy Earl Welliver, MTS ©LPI
