



#### **GOSPEL MEDITATION - Luke 10: 38-42**

Once I went to a hospice facility to celebrate Last Rites for an elderly dying man. His family had told me that he had been uncommunicative for days. At the conclusion of the ritual, we began to recite the Our Father prayer. To everyone's surprise, his lips



moved, clearly mouthing the words to the Lord's prayer. Stripped of most of his faculties, the man could still pray those precious God-given petitions. A lifetime of prayer had planted the words even deeper than his failing consciousness.

Do we want the Lord's prayer to be as deeply embedded in us? If we want to be people of hope, we should. Recall that our Lord immediately follows the prayer by saying: "Ask, and it will be given to you; search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened to you" (Luke 11:9). We only ask, search and knock because we hope that the request is not in vain. Everything we could possibly hope for is contained in the prayer. Praying the Our Father deepens our hope.

We should consciously pour all our hopes into the Lord's prayer; we should allow it to be an expression of hope, not simply rote words. Then, over time, it builds up our hope in God. It sinks deep into our souls and bodies. How blessed we are when these words of hope are on our lips, even when everything else seems to fail.

# LET'S BUILD A CULTURE OF LIFE



#### LIFE WASN'T GOING WELL FOR DAVE

- The relationships with his wife and children were rocky, he lashed out at those closest to him, and he drank too much. He felt a deep sense of loss and a grief that would not go away.

He knew something was wrong with his life but did not know where to start to change it.

A friend knew that Dave was involved in two abortions before he married. Dave admitted that the abortions bothered him but did not see how those could be connected to his problems. Dave signed up for a **Project Joseph Retreat** weekend. Since 2014 this program has helped men see the damage done by abortion. Loss, grief and guilt are at the core of every story regardless of how the man was involved.

Project Joseph creates a space to explore issues like damaged fatherhood and marriage relationships. It allows men to honestly look at their role in that tragic event, whether active or passive, and how it relates to their current struggles in life. The path to healing involves reconnecting in love with one's aborted child. A man will carry the burden of this loss forever if the relationship is not repaired. In a place of emotional and spiritual safety they can grieve that loss, making room in their father's heart for the reconciliation, healing and peace of the Lord.

And it is not just the father of the child who needs healing. The college roommate who drives the friend to the abortion facility, the brother who loans money to a sibling to have the procedure, or the man who encourages and affirms a friend's decision to abort – all are deeply wounded by their intimate connection to that child's death.

Dave found healing after the retreat. He stopped drinking, began to have a deeper love and appreciation for his wife and to value his living children. He now serves on the Project Joseph team to help other men affected by abortion. (Source: Pregnancy Help News)

#### FIRST SATURDAY DEVOTION -

Next Saturday, **August 2**, is the First Saturday of the month. Our Lady came to Fatima, Portugal, in 1917 to give us a message through three shepherd children. One key



aspect is her request for the Five First Saturdays of reparation to her Immaculate Heart. This is an individual devotion which you can begin any month. **Guidelines and prayer cards are in the acrylic pamphlet holder on the table in the back of the church**.

One devotion requirement is to receive Holy Communion. We can receive the Eucharist at our Saturday Vigil Mass as long as we attend a second Mass that weekend to meet our Sunday obligation. However, two area churches do have a Saturday morning Mass.
